#BeggarFreeIndia

In a country as big and beautiful as India, beggars on the street is a harsh reality of the socioeconomic challenges that still exist. We believe begging is not just about poverty but lack of opportunities, education, and support. Our “Beggar Free India” campaign aims to address these root causes and build a society where everyone can live with dignity.

Begging is a symptom of deeper societal problems like unemployment, lack of education, and an inadequate social support system. Children, women, and the elderly are most vulnerable, forced into begging due to circumstances beyond their control. At Helping Hut, we take a holistic approach by providing sustainable solutions that empower individuals rather than temporary relief.

To eradicate this problem of begging, the NGO has come upon the idea of the **“Beggar Free India Campaign,”** which aims to create awareness among people about the harsh reality of people involved in begging on the streets for several years.

We provide vocational education facilities that strive to increase employability and increase literacy among the economically backward strata of society that will stimulate them to become independent bread earners of the family. This will not only create awareness of self-employment but also create a greater impact on the rest of the individuals.



There are several instances in which the contribution is led by the volunteers for the success of this campaign.

- **Awareness Campaign:** Volunteers from Team New Delhi launched an impactful campaign with posters stating "Let's Pledge for a Beggar Free India" in Connaught Place, Central Delhi. Armed with compelling signs, they engaged with the public, highlighting the harsh realities of begging and advocating for sustainable solutions. The key message was to discourage giving money, which perpetuates dependency, and instead provide long-term assistance. This campaign soon spread to Varanasi and Gwalior, where the NGO collaborated with local communities to raise awareness and develop actionable plans to support those involved in begging. By focusing on education, skills training, and the provision of essential resources, the movement aimed to empower individuals and reduce reliance on begging, fostering a more self-reliant and dignified future for them.
- **Gifts to Beggars:** As part of the Beggar-Free India Movement, volunteers generously donated gift boxes to beggars containing practical items such as stationery and other useful materials. These gift boxes were designed not only to provide immediate relief but also to offer opportunities for economic independence. By equipping individuals with items they can sell or use to enhance their skills, the initiative aimed to empower them to move away from begging and towards a more self-sufficient future.
- **Beggar Transformation:** Our aim is to transform beggars into self-reliant and independent individuals. One such example is of Dwarka. A man who used to be a tailor could not continue with his profession for some reasons and opted to beg. A sewing machine was donated to him. As a result, he restarted his profession and led a dignified life.

The "Beggar Free India" campaign is not about removing beggars from the streets; it's about transforming lives and building a society where everyone has the opportunity to thrive. We are committed to making this vision a reality. Together, we can create a Beggar-Free India. Hence, we are looking forward to more such transformations to create greater impact in society.

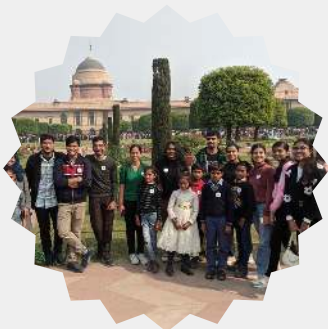

Slum Survey

We prioritised understanding the unique challenges faced by marginalized communities. Our recent Slum Survey in Delhi aimed to gain deeper insights into the living conditions, needs, and aspirations of slum residents. This comprehensive survey was a crucial step towards designing and implementing effective interventions that brought about meaningful change. Our dedicated team of volunteers conducted door-to-door interviews, engaging with residents to gather detailed information about various aspects of their lives, including access to clean water, sanitation, healthcare, education, and employment opportunities. This personal interaction allowed us to build trust and ensure that the community's voice was heard and respected.

The survey revealed several pressing issues that required immediate attention. Many residents lacked access to clean drinking water and proper sanitation facilities, which led to health problems. Educational opportunities for children were limited, with many unable to attend school regularly due to financial constraints. Unemployment was prevalent, contributing to the cycle of poverty. Additionally, there were significant gaps in healthcare access, with many residents unable to afford or reach medical services.



Slipper Distribution Drive

“Discover the joy of giving, and you will discover the reason for living.” By living this philosophy, Team Gwalior organized a slippers distribution drive at Phoolbagh Chouraha with the aim of providing comfort and protection to underprivileged children.

During the event, around 35 pairs of slippers were distributed to poor children, addressing a critical need for basic footwear. Phoolbagh Chouraha, a bustling area in Gwalior, was chosen to ensure high visibility and reach to those in need.

The drive was facilitated by a dedicated team of volunteers, including both seasoned members and enthusiastic new recruits. They organized the slippers by size and type, guiding the children to select pairs that fit well and provided comfort.

This initiative not only improved the immediate comfort and mobility of the recipients but also contributed to the overall betterment of health and hygiene by protecting their feet from injuries and infections. The volunteers experienced a profound sense of fulfilment, reinforced by the gratitude and smiles of the children.



Summer Kit Distribution Drive



To cope with the hot weather, the teams located in Gorakhpur and Gwalior finished a summer kit distribution drive. Essential needs assessment was done by volunteers from door-to-door interviews of local residents, revealing major items that were needed for the heat season. Following the results of this poll, glucose packs were distributed to supplement energy and water levels, cotton fabrics were offered that provided breathable coverage from the sun rays, plastic bottles provided uncomplicated access to drinking clean water, as well as basic medical aids like ORS (Oral Rehydration Salts), antiseptic creams, and bandages to take care of minor heating-related health problems.

This event took place in an organised manner, targeting structured distributions with appropriate precautions and hygiene norms. The community responded very positively towards this venture, especially some individuals, such as elderly people, young ones, and workers who did most of their activities outside, who normally experience more difficulties during the summer heat than others because they had limited resources at their disposal. Volunteers talked about their good experiences, which included smiling and thanksgiving as exemplified by happy faces, since even a single positive intervention could greatly help in making the most of it.



Environment Day Celebration



We spread the importance of grassroots initiatives in celebrating World Environment Day. Through various activities and events, we motivate volunteers to raise awareness and implement practical solutions to environmental challenges.

This year, Team Mau celebrated the Environment Day with a special event that was meant to spread a cleaner and greener future. On roads all around the town of Mau, volunteers and organizers joined up with newly enthusiastic members who wanted to plant. They dug holes in the ground, planted the saplings into them, put some soil on top, and built brick protection walls to protect the young plants from damages caused by wind or flying objects. This program not only improved local greenery but also made participants proud of themselves through their unity. It was an occasion that showed how important community-based activities can be as far as environmental conservation is concerned; therefore we were reminded of our collective duty towards safeguarding our planet.



Sanitary Pads Distribution Drive

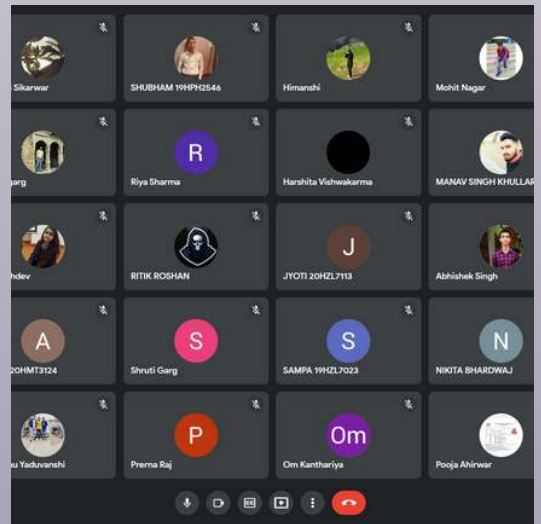
Volunteer Meetup
